BASE CHIEF'S MESSAGE

Hello Base Team,

I would like to note the paying of compliments and the ceremonies of Colours and Sunset. In the military, a salute is a compliment that traditionally demonstrates trust and respect. Although the method of saluting varies with circumstances, the paying of compliments is a fundamental requirement that is indispensable to service discipline.

The most common occasions where saluting is required at CFB Halifax are:

- 1. **Showing respect to commissioned officers.** This is completed by turning your head in their direction, saluting, and offering a non-formal, professional greeting.
- 2. **Passing of a DND vehicle.** Vehicles carrying senior officers can be identified by their distinctive license plates and/or pennants. Members shall salute as they are passed.
- 3. **Colours and Sunset.** During the ceremony of Colours/Sunset or upon hearing the playing of the National Anthem, all personnel in uniform shall come to attention and salute in the general direction of the nearest flag as it is being raised or lowered. Personnel in motor vehicles shall stop, disembark the vehicle and salute while in uniform. Military personnel in civilian attire shall stop, disembark the vehicle (if applicable) and come to attention facing in the direction of the nearest flag. All civilian members of the DND team are also encouraged to take a moment, step out of their vehicles if embarked and pay their respects to the flag.

These are all important aspects of our military culture and traditions that must be maintained to demonstrate the disciplined and professional force we are. More information on drill and ceremonial can be found here.
