BASE COMMANDER'S MESSAGE

May is a time for renewal and reflection, and this month marks milestones that are central to who we are as a Defence community. May 4 marks the <u>Royal Canadian Navy</u> (RCN)'s 114th birthday. With over a hundred years of service, the RCN has long been "Ready, Aye, Ready" to protect the freedom, security, and sovereignty of people in Canada as well as keep the world's citizens and waterways safe. As a submariner myself, I am incredibly proud of our community and its achievements over the years. Wishing all our friends and colleagues across the RCN – from coast to coast to coast – a very happy birthday!



On Sunday, May 5, we will commemorate the 79th anniversary of the end of the <u>Battle of the Atlantic</u> (BOA). The BOA – the longest continuous military campaign of the Second World War – was a veritable turning point in our history that saw the RCN grow to become one of the largest navies in the world. Throughout this battle, thousands of RCN, Canadian Merchant Navy, and Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) members and their allies faced perilous conditions in the hopes of ending a devastating war.

The BOA's legacy and memories of those who fought in it will not be dimmed or forgotten by the passing years. The stories and success of past sailors and aviators remain an inspiration and proud chapter in Canadian and naval military history. We are grateful for our veterans' bravery and sacrifice, and attending BOA celebrations is a simple way to honour them. I strongly encourage you to seek out and attend local events including our BOA ceremony at Point Pleasant Park Sailors' Memorial on Sunday, May 5, starting at 10:30 am ADT.

May 5-11 is <u>Emergency Preparedness Week</u> (EP Week), a national event supported by Public Safety Canada that we observe here at CFB Halifax. EP Week is a good opportunity to ensure that we are prepared to protect ourselves, our families, and our community, and is a perfect time to get reacquainted with our <u>Base Emergency Response Plan</u>.

Several other important events and activities are taking place in May, notably Red Dress Day and the Moose Hide Campaign, the International Day Against Homophobia, Biphobia and Transphobia, Indigenous Awareness Week, and National AccessAbility Week (you can find more details further in this newsletter). If you can participate in or learn more about some or all of these events – and in doing so, represent our diverse and proud Defence community – I highly encourage you to do so.



BASE CHIEF'S MESSAGE

With spring fully in swing, there is a notable increase in Defence Team members using alternative modes of transportation, such as scooters, e-scooters, bikes, e-bikes, etc. I would like to take this opportunity to remind drivers to share the road with other vehicles and pedestrians and to take a moment to double check their surroundings for everyone's continued safety.

For those utilizing alternative modes of transportation, please remember, safety helmets are to be worn by drivers and passengers, whether in uniform or civilian attire. When in uniform, the applicable service head-dress

is to be carried for wear immediately on dismount from the vehicle. The helmet is not to be embellished with offensive designs, and military insignia is not to be worn on the helmet. Scooters and electric bicycles shall not exceed 25 km/h and are not permitted to be used on sidewalks. INFRASTRUCTURE



Energy Performance Contract

Several energy conservation projects are currently underway across CFB Halifax properties. Examples of these projects/measures include:

- Installation of a solar wall at the Base Logistics Transport, Electrical and Mechanical Engineering building (Willow Park WL57) that will preheat air for the HVAC system.
- Installation of a photovoltaic solar array in Shearwater that will produce electricity and offset the total power requirements for that property.
- Installation of hot water heat pumps in a number of facilities that will heat the domestic hot water at a higher efficiency than standard electric hot water heaters.
- Replacement of inefficient, oil-fired boilers with natural gas high efficiency condensing gas boilers in several facilities.
- Installation of a mechanical system at the Shearwater Arena that will allow for waste heat to be recovered from the arena's ice plant while in operation and be used in the arena and Shearwater Fitness, Sports & Recreation Centre to supplement Central Heating Plant heat for various mechanical systems.

In Canada, period poverty affects the health and dignity of individuals who menstruate straight across this country. One in three Canadians under 25 who menstruate have struggled to afford menstrual products. Boxes can be available upon request to the Halifax Defence Women's Advisory Organization (DWAO). 


