
BASE COMMANDER'S MESSAGE

INFRASTRUCTURE

Land-Based Testing Facility

New updates are available from the Department of National Defence regarding the construction of a Land-Based Testing Facility (LBTF) at Hartlen Point in Eastern Passage, Nova Scotia. This facility and capability will allow our Royal Canadian Navy to bring its future Canadian Surface Combatant ships into service while supporting them throughout their lifecycle.

LBTF project updates include:

- 1. an update on the status of current site preparation work;
- 2. a construction update including the most recent rendering of the LBTF (subject to change as the design progresses);
- 3. further details on the Radio Frequency licensing process; and
- 4. an updated Frequently Asked Questions page.

About the Canadian Surface Combatant Project

The Government of Canada is procuring 15 new Canadian Surface Combatant ships for the Royal Canadian Navy. This new fleet will upgrade and replace the capabilities of the current Halifax-class frigates and retired Iroquois-class destroyers. The new fleet of ships will be tested and trialed in Halifax, Nova Scotia, and will be known as River-class destroyers.




