


BASE COMMANDER'S MESSAGE

With the change in seasons comes changes to seasonal dress. Effective Monday, October 20, 2025, winter dress will be in effect for CAF members (NAVORD 5250-0 ART 3.2). As always, please remember to be vigilant of appearance and uniform fit. If your uniform is ill-fitting or in need of repair, remember to get it tailored or exchanged to ensure you are comfortable and in compliance with CAF dress instruction. Later this month, on Friday, October 31, will begin the <u>Royal</u> <u>Canadian Legion (RCL) Poppy campaign</u>, during which CAF

personnel shall wear the red poppy – an emblem to commemorate those Canadians who died in battle – on all uniforms until Remembrance Day. Of note, <u>Indigenous crafted poppies</u> (meant to honour the contributions of First Nations, Inuit, and Métis peoples) are also authorized to be worn on CAF uniforms, in the same manner as the RCL poppies. Civilian Defence Team members are encouraged to wear a poppy during this time as well.

What we wear and how we wear it holds much symbolic meaning, historical significance, cultural identity, and pride in our ethos. Thank you for representing the best of Defence – to our ranks, civilian colleagues, and the wider community. Wishing you a safe and reflective start to this season of remembrance.

Dockyard South Access Gate

Effective September 29, the Dockyard South Access Gate (between HMCS Scotian, D193, and the Base Logistics HAZMAT building, D207) will be open weekdays from 0600–1700 hrs for pedestrians, cyclists, and other non-vehicle traffic. Access will be granted only to individuals with valid CAF ID (NDI-20), DND civilian ID (NDI-21), other approved NDIS-listed IDs, or those on a Visitor Access List (VAL) with government-issued photo ID. Motor vehicles will not be permitted through this gate. Vehicular access remains available at Rainbow, Admiral's, and Niobe Gates.



DID YOU KNOW?

Our Base Operations team recently added to its security response capabilities with the introduction of four, brand new Waterborne Security Response Vessels (WRSVs).

Berthed alongside His Majesty's Canadian Dockyard, these vessels will be used for waterborne security of the Dockyard and other CFB Halifax properties that border the Halifax Harbour and Bedford Basin. The WRSVs will enhance our capability and efficiency by allowing our members to be on the water longer, out of the weather, and comfortable for a longer period when called upon to support.

Training to safely and effectively operate the WRSVs is currently being rolled out across Canadian Fleet Atlantic, with 20 boatswains already trained and ready to provide waterborne security response if/when needed. Video.
