


BASE COMMANDER'S MESSAGE

Many thanks to those involved in this momentous ceremony and to the many sailors who crewed these Maritime Coastal Defence Vessels throughout their almost three decades of service. I would also like to acknowledge all members of the Steward occupation, some of whom attended a Steward commemorative event on October 30 here at CFB Halifax (a similar event is being held at CFB Esquimalt on November 6). As the phasing out of this occupation continues, please know that your dedication while serving as Stewards was (and remains) appreciated and commended.

This month, I hope you take time to remember and pay respect to our veteran community. A good way to show solidarity with veterans is to attend a local <u>Veterans' Week</u> event, such as the <u>Veterans Open Mic Night</u> (November 7), the Stadacona Band's <u>"Our Veterans, Their Stories" concert</u> (November 9), and of course, Indigenous Veterans' Day (November 8) and Remembrance Day (November 11) ceremonies. Friday, October 31 marked the official start of remembrance season with the beginning of the <u>2025 Poppy Campaign</u>. Many commemorative ceremonies and events will take place across the Halifax Regional Municipality on Remembrance Day (November 11) and from November 5-11 in recognition of Veterans' Week 2025. I strongly encourage Defence Team members to attend events within their communities to stand in pride with those who have served and shaped our country. And please note that uniformed members attending a Remembrance Day ceremony are required to dress in No. 1A with medals.

Until Remembrance Day, please do not forget that all military personnel are required to wear the poppy on their uniform, as a

visual pledge to honour Canada's veterans. Of note, <u>Indigenous crafted poppies</u> (meant to honour the contributions of First Nations, Inuit, and Métis peoples) are also authorized to be worn on CAF uniforms, in the same manner as the RCL poppies. Civilian Defence Team members are also encouraged to wear a poppy during this time.

As always, please remember to be vigilant of appearance and uniform fit, especially when attending public commemorations. There is always strength in numbers when we collectively remember and honour the legacy and service of our veterans.

Reminder: Dockyard South Access Gate

The Dockyard South Access Gate (between HMCS *Scotian*, D193, and the Base Logistics HAZMAT building, D207) is now open weekdays* from 0600–1700 hrs for pedestrians, cyclists, and other non-vehicle traffic. *Closed on all <u>public holidays</u>. Access will be granted only to individuals with valid CAF ID (NDI-20), DND civilian ID (NDI-21), other approved NDIS-listed IDs, or those on a Visitor Access List (VAL) with government-issued photo ID.

Motor vehicles are not permitted through this gate. Vehicular access remains available at Rainbow, Admiral's, and Niobe Gates.

Created almost six years ago by Sgt Alan Coleman, the CFB Halifax Web Map Application was initially meant to be an electronic version of the King's Harbour Master daily sitrep to find ship locations. It was later expanded to include information about current parking and roadway impacts due to construction, special events, etc.
